Scholarship Application

Scholarships are available through the First United Methodist Church of Lancaster, Ohio, to provide financial assistance to members of the church who plan to pursue or are currently enrolled in a program of higher education. For the purposes of the scholarship program, “higher education” is defined as follows:

1. A degree program at any Council for Higher Education accredited institution within the U.S., or
2. A degree or certification program that is provided by a college, university, technical school or arts institute that is intended to prepare the learner for his or her future career/profession.

Members in good standing of FUMC of Lancaster for a minimum of one year are eligible to apply. Applications from members of less than one year may be considered on a case by case basis.

All applications must be returned to the Business Office no later than March 31. Late applications will not be considered. The selection process will begin in April with the intent to notify award recipients in May. Please note that it is very important that you complete all requested information on the application, as all information submitted will be used in the selection process.

Awards will be mailed to recipients in early summer in the form of a check made out to the student and the university/school he or she will be attending.
